

The moving process can be stressful. This list is designed to help reduce the stress by taking care of some of the most critical details of your move.

EIGHT WEEKS BEFORE	THREE WEEKS BEFORE
Line up movers.	Arrange to have the utilities disconnected a few days after the move.
Look into truck rental prices, if you're doing it	
yourself.	Get the utilities set up at your new residence.
Make an inventory of everything you own.	Start packing room by room.
Decide what goes in the truck, car or trash.	Arrange for a babysitter on moving day if you need one.
Consider where you want to place furniture in your new home.	Reserve the freight elevator in your building for moving day.
SIX WEEKS BEFORE	
Clear out your closets.	TWO WEEKS BEFORE
Have a yard sale.	Arrange to move plants and pets.
Transfer your children's academic records to their new school.	Get rid of items you're not allowed to move, such a gasoline and propane.
Transfer medical records to your new doctor.	Keep packing.
FOUR WEEKS BEFORE	Line up helpers to assist with loading your rental truck.
Reserve a truck or trailer for a DIY move.	Consider hiring a plumber or electrician to disconnect appliances you plan to move.
Confirm the booking with your moving company.	
Arrange to have the movers come over two days	ONE WEEK BEFORE
before moving day, if they are packing for you.	Open your new bank accounts if you're making a
Get boxes and packing tape, if you are doing it	long-distance move. Make sure you have enough medication to last through the move. Have your doctor write a new prescription you can fill after you move.

Start packing out-of-season clothing and other items you won't need right away.	
Fill out change-of-address cards at the post office.	
	Defrost the refrigerator two days before you move
Notify friends, family, the bank and your insurance agent of your new address.	benost the remgerator two days before you move
Pre-order appliances, furniture, dishes and cutlery.	
Send a change-of-address email to any magazines you subscribe to.
